Hello Penny Apprentices,

Your help is needed. I have overseen the U.S. Mints production of the Cent since 1793. But now the end is near! Can you help secure my legacy? I need your help to determine what cents are in circulation! If you choose to help, you may be able to earn your CPA – Certified Penny Apprentice!

Your goal is to find U.S. Cents from circulation. Cents in circulation can be found in banks, stores, and pocket change etc. You can use your current coin collection to add to your final presentation.

Also, identify every type of U.S. Mint Cent produced for circulation! Present every type with pictures or actual coins, dates of circulation, size & weight and anything that will add to your display!

Here is what to look for:

- Look for “wheat” pennies! The more you find the more points you earn!



- Save every 1982 cent! The more the better. How many Denver minted cents did you find? How



many from Philadelphia?

- Find a cent from every decade from 1960 to 2025! Did you find any from the decade before the 1960s?
- Save every 2009 cent you find.



- Save any foreign coins while searching? (ie Canadian cent)



- Save every cent made of copper! (Pre-1982 date cents) How many did you find? Put them in cent

- Find every cent from the year of your birth to (and including) 2023! You will be given a cent book to collect the cents. Can you find the cents in shiny, new uncirculated condition (**Red Cents**)?



- Save every cent from 2024 & 2025!



- Add an “Elongated Cent” to your collection! A list of machine locations can be found at PennyCollector.com - [The official website for elongated pennies, penny books and penny machines](http://PennyCollector.com)



- Save any “S” minted cents – from San Francisco!



- Keep track of how many rolls of cents you searched!

Please bring the results of your search to the September 12, 2025, WCNS YN meeting. How lucky were you? (Did you find any dimes in cent rolls?) What else did you find?
